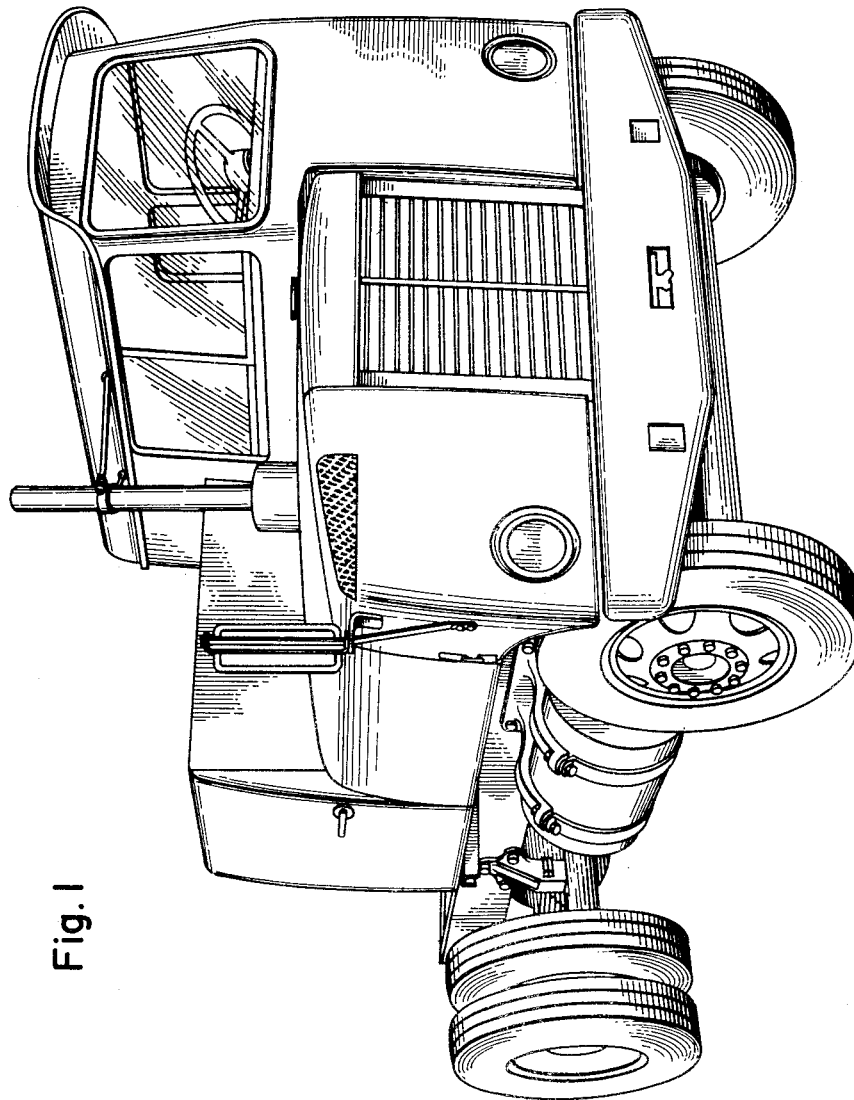

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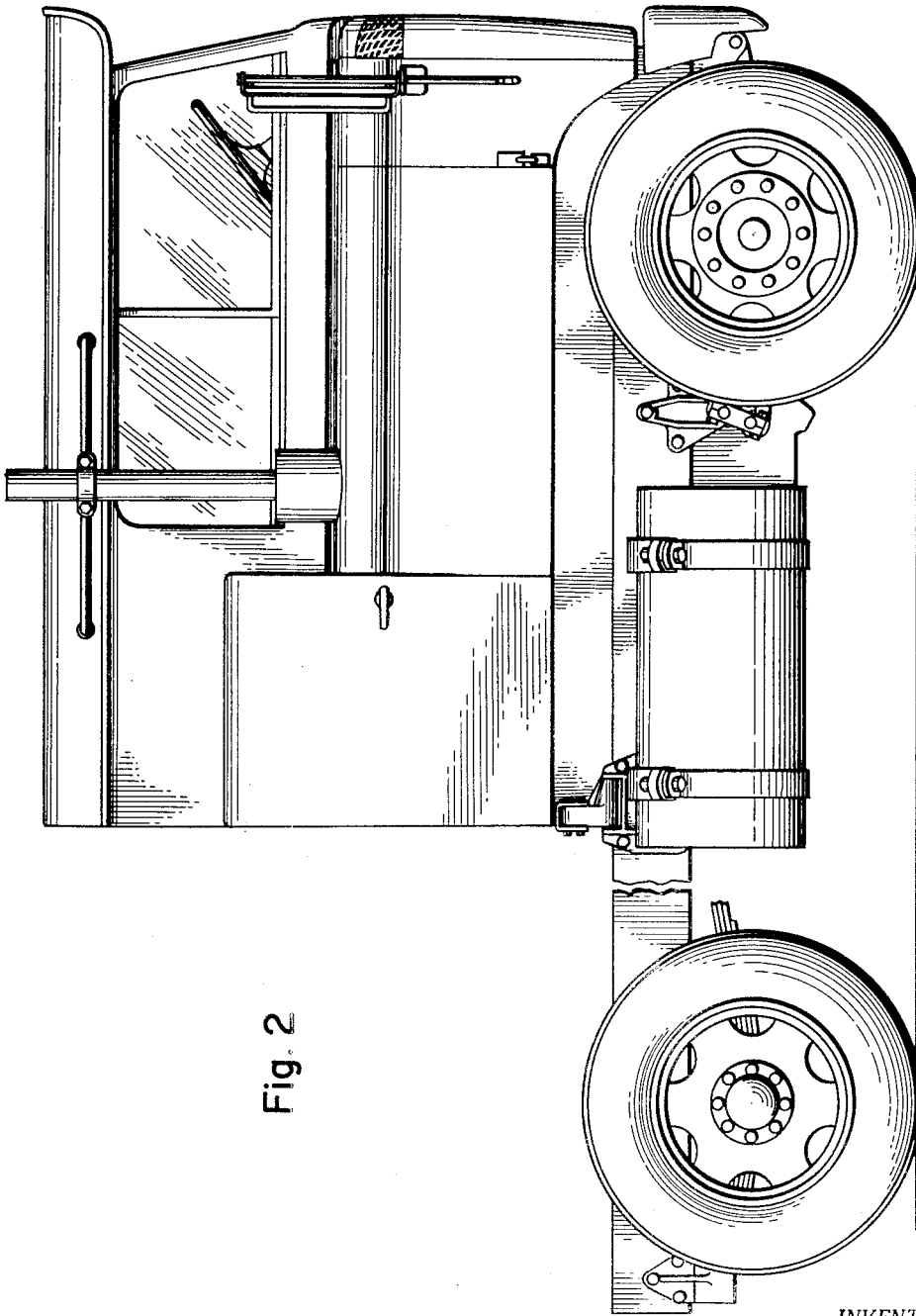

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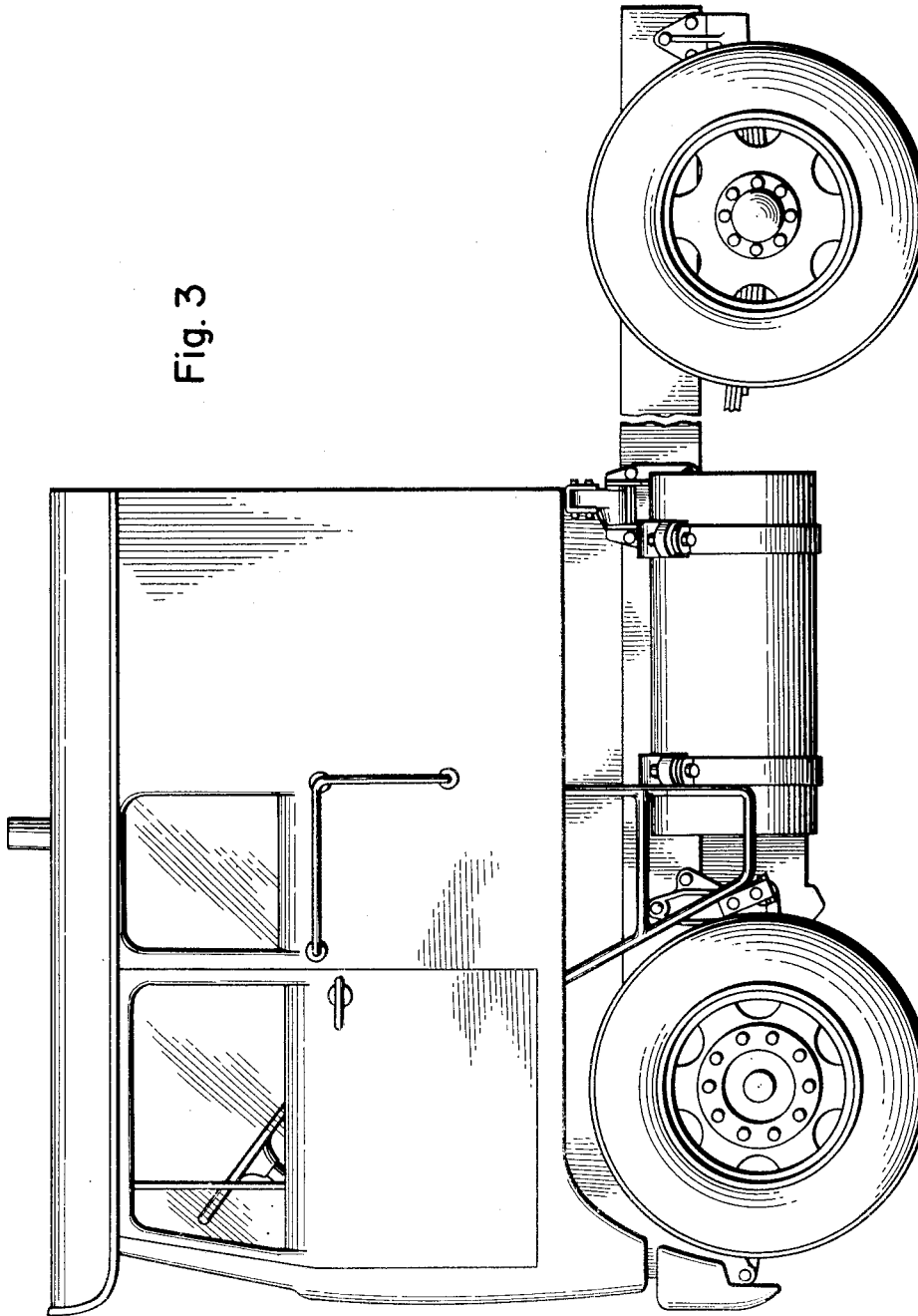

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Gideon Kramer, a citizen of the United States of America, and a resident of Seattle, county of King, and State of Washington, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for an Engine-Beside-Cab Truck, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, forming a part thereof.

In said drawings:

Figure 1 is a perspective view of an engine-beside-cab truck showing my new design; and

Figs. 2 and 3 are each fragmentary side elevational views thereof.
